Candice M. Minear SCHOLARSHIP

Candice N. Minear Scholarship

This fund was established in memory of Candice N. Minear of Kansas City, Missouri by The Whole Person to provide educational scholarships to people with disabilities who have been accepted into the Masters of Public Administration Program at UMKC (the same program as Candice Minear graduated from) and whose interests and values most align with those of the late Candice N. Minear. Funds may cover tuition, books, and fees.

Deadline to apply: June 15, 2017

Students eligible for assistance shall be:

- 1. In the age range of 20-45 years.
- 2. A person with a disability.
- 3. Accepted to, and/or attending the Masters of Public Administration program at UMKC. This program prepares entrepreneurial and innovative public service leaders and executives to be effective and successful in an increasingly complex and dynamic world, and to effectively and ethically lead and manage dynamic public service organizations.
- 4. Possess a minimum 3.0 GPA on 4 point scale.
- 5. Passionate about learning and able to articulate how their education will be used in their future career. This should be illustrated by writing an essay about the personal attributes and characteristics of the student that indicate their ability and commitment to persevere to degree completion.

Amount of Award:

The amount of the award shall not exceed \$1,500 and disbursed payable to the student and the institution in one payment in August 2017. The scholarship is not renewable. Consideration will be given to those with financial need.

Award Selection Committee:

The applications will be reviewed by a committee established by The Whole Person and may include the Manager of Resource Development, member/members of Candice's family, and the President of the Greater Kansas City Spinal Cord Association. The scholarship will be announced late-June 2017.

- 1. Are you involved with a non-profit or any kind of community volunteerism?
- If you answered "yes", describe the experience. Include name of organization, year/s participated, name of specific program in which you participated, activities in which you were involved, what you learned and personal development tools you acquired that will assist you with your educational and/or career endeavors.

Essay/Personal Statement

Please write an essay/personal statement in 300 words or less, explaining how your passion for knowledge and education will be used in your future career. Share the personal attributes, characteristics, abilities and commitment you possess that will assist you to persevere to degree completion.

Your essay/personal statement should describe in detail significant experiences, challenges, achievements and special interests. A few examples to consider:

- (a) Describe your childhood environment. Include your household make-up, share who significantly influenced or affected you and how;
- (b) Describe your disability and how it has impacted your life and independence;
- (c) Describe the challenges you have faced because of your disability and the steps you have taken to address the challenges.

Provide a detailed education budget and include:
