Michelle Krajewski served on the NCIL Board of Directors as Region VII Representative for the past three years. NCIL is receiving an outpouring of sadness from advocates across the United States who knew her for her work in Missouri and on the national level. From these many expressions of grief and loss, it is clear that Michelle was not only a dedicated colleague and respected advocate, but also a true friend.

For those of us who were lucky enough to know Michelle, her passion and personality exuded. She was not known for politeness in advocacy, rather for giving hell to anyone standing in the way of progress. She was known for her energy, talent, and strength of character.

We will miss our dear friend and colleague immensely. Even though we knew of her battle with cancer, her passing comes as a surprise to most. There was something about Michelle that made everyone feel as though she could beat anything. For those of us left to remember her,

it is hard to accept that someone so young and full of life could ever leave us so soon. NCIL members and staff are devastated and completely heartbroken, but look forward to celebrating the life and legacy of a woman that will not be forgotten. Her picture will now hang at NCIL headquarters in Washington, D.C. forever as a reminder of what makes this organization great. We will cherish her legacy and use it to inspire advocates to action in a way that befits her memory.

Michelle stands today as an example of how our business should be done, with fire, dedication, and courage. We are not likely to find another person like Michelle Krajewski in this lifetime, but we will remember our friend and continue her life's work in a way that we hope would make her proud.

Words cannot convey the sorrow and loss that is felt with her passing. However, knowing Michelle, she would likely want us to celebrate instead of grieve, and share stories about her remarkable life and incredible sense of humor.

TWP Supports Anti-Bullying Education with "Bully Bot"

On January 21, The Whole Person, in partnership with Theatre for Young America and VSA Missouri, hosted a reception and a performance of the play "Bully Bot the Robot and the Gang of Geeks" at H&R Block City Stage in Kansas City's Union Station. More than 140 guests mingled before the play while enjoying wine, refreshments and art from VSA artist David Kontra.

After the play, SuEllen Fried (nationally known author and speaker) facilitated a discussion with the audience on the bullying and harassment of youth with disabilities, pictured above. TWP staff members with disabilities led similar discussions, spreading the anti-bullying message at additional performances of the play, including traveling performances at eleven local schools.



DaVita teammates, along with their friends and families, came from as far as Colorado and Oklahoma to contribute over 900 volunteer hours to DaVita's "Community First" day for TWP. One consumer said, "they were like friends coming together to have a good time."

That's Trader Joe's in Leawood!

When you visit Greg Pavlakis's apartment, one thing will be immediately evident: he is creative and skilled at working with Legos.® When TWP Employment Advocates arrived for their interview, they saw that Greg has combined those colorful interlocking plastic bricks to create vehicles, buildings, even working robots. The Advocates realized that these intricate creations indicated some transferable skills: building and arranging objects, and a keen sense of design and detail orientation.

"These observations provided the team with valuable information that could be used to develop a good job match for Greg," noted Susan Herrin, Employment Services Director. Susan explained that her team interviewed Greg to learn more about his work history, preferences, skills, experience, and potential contributions that he could bring to an employer. "Greg told us that his favorite job had been working at a record store... He liked the environment, and he liked working for a business that had a strong commitment to the community." An idea for a job match began to emerge.

Just two months earlier, TWP had developed a relationship with the new Trader Joe's store in Leawood, Kansas. TWP had shared inclusive recruiting strategies with Trader Joe's management and had also agreed to assist them with their hiring efforts. "We knew that Trader Joe's fun,

supportive environment and their commitment to the community would be a good values-match for Greg, and their Crew Member position matched his skills," said Susan. "We encouraged Greg to visit the store... he visited right away and was excited about the opportunity."

Greg applied for the position, was hired and has been working there ever since. Greg has become a popular member of the Trader Joe's family, receiving promotions and making friends. One of his co-workers even threw a surprise birthday party for Greg complete with a "Legos®" cake.

When asked about having his story included in The Whole Person's newsletter, Greg had only one caveat: "Please be sure that everyone knows that I am at the Trader Joe's store in Leawood." Consider it done, Greg.

Pam Goes Pro at KC CakeFest

Pam Sanders didn't win a single prize at KC CakeFest, but she couldn't be happier about it. That's because Pam didn't enter the cake competition to win a trophy—she entered with something to prove.

With multiple sclerosis (MS), type 1 diabetes, and vision loss, Pam just wanted to prove to herself that she could accomplish anything she put her mind to. "So I entered the highly-competitive wedding cake category with a go-big-or-go-home attitude...and I showed everyone that you can do it, it doesn't matter if you have a disability," she explained.

Pam had been decorating cakes in her northwest Missouri hometown for about a year and a half when a friend told her about KC CakeFest, a benefit for TWP held on March 3-4 at the Kansas City Convention Center. "Sometimes in small towns there is a stigma for people with disabilities. When I heard that KC CakeFest was donating all proceeds to an organization that helps people with disabilities, I knew this was the contest for me."

Pam wasn't nervous about the tough competition or the nationally-renowned cake judges. Far from her hometown, she was worried about being out of her comfort zone. Her fears were quickly eased by the fun atmosphere and supportive volunteers at the KC CakeFest, "Never since I've been diagnosed had I been so comfortable in a setting outside of my family! The disabilities didn't matter; it was iust about the fun!"

Pam's positive experience at KC CakeFest inspired her to turn her hobby into a career: she's now building a professional kitchen in her basement to start her own business. "Everyone was so nice and wonderful! And I was impressed that there were so many volunteers with disabilities... my desire to go professional was triggered from KC CakeFest. It was fantastic."



Over 20 celebrity cake artists from such shows as TLC's Ultimate Cake Off and WE TV's Wedding Cake Wars, including Megan Unverferth, Charity George, Chris Hedlund, Dianna Lopez pictured above, came to participate in three live TV-style challenges and to teach classes.

The star-studded event garnered much media attention with 3,323 media hits and brought in 661 new supporters for The Whole Person.

Expressions Celebrates Artists with Disabilities

On May 4, nearly 500 people attended the second annual Expressions art reception at the Jones Gallery in the Crossroads Art District. Expressions featured photography, painting, drawing, mixed media and hand-made jewelry from a group of 11 local



artists with a diverse range of disabilities. Guests were moved by the inspiring stories, independent living, and therapeutic art experiences of the gifted artists.

"Displaying my pieces was one of my greatest adventures and the selling of one of my pieces was one of the best events ever," said featured artist Waunder Oshinbanjo.

Thanks to support from UMB and the Francis Family Foundation, Expressions was a well-received success providing a valuable opportunity to highlight the strengths, talents and abilities of people with disabilities.

Devin Finds his Voice

This past spring, TWP was happy to celebrate Devin's graduation from The Whole Family Project (WFP). Devin's journey began in 2009, when his family was concerned that he was two years old and not able to speak or communicate. They were referred to The Whole Family Project and quickly assigned a tutor. Devin's parents and family members participated in his tutoring sessions, helping him make great progress in learning to sign his feelings, colors and food. The Whole Family Project helps nonverbal children learn to communicate well using sign so their parents can understand them. Learning to sign can also help the brain develop language connections, so that when a child like Devin is able to speak more clearly and be understood, the need for sign is reduced. "Once those brain synapses connected with Devin, it was amazing to watch his transformation," said WFP Program Coordinator Vicki Walker.
