This summer marks the 29th anniversary of the signing of the Americans with Disabilities Act. The Whole Person will celebrate the occasion with a brand new spin on the event that we have called the July Jubilee for the past four years. The Main Street Music Festival will be held on Saturday, July 27th at Washington Square Park in the Crossroads across from the Westin Crown Center.

This event will feature five local bands, our own inclusive choral group, Tota Voces, a beer garden, a kid's corner, food trucks and vendors. "It is our hope that people will bring their lawn chairs or a blanket and come and spend the

day with us," says Terri Goddard, the Manager of Resource Development for The Whole Person. "We have diverse genres of music represented and many, many roving entertainers. We want this to be an event that becomes part of the summer tradition for families in Kansas City and a fun way to spend the day. They say music is the international language for bringing people together, and that is what we are doing," Goddard says.

Employment Services Extends to Kansas

New training program

The Whole Person (TWP) is now accepting referrals for people who live in Kansas through a collaboration with Kansas Vocational Rehabilitation. Along with extending employment services to Kansans, TWP is also working with Pre-Employment Transition Services, which assists high school students in job exploration, counseling, and an array of services that help them prepare for employment.

The Employment Department is also in the process of launching EmployAbilities – a three-stage, eight week, comprehensive private-pay employment training program for residents of Kansas and Missouri created by TWP. The program's goal is to provide young job seekers (at least 18 years old) with developmental disabilities an opportunity to refine their working and job-seeking skill sets. While EmployAbilities will focus on training in the TWP catering kitchen, students will acquire skills that will serve them in any employment environment where they have an interest in working.

During Stage 1, the students will focus on creating goals and identifying challenges they might face due to their disabilities during classroom time. The instruction will focus on organizational skills, life skills, and advocacy. During Stage 2, the students will spend five weeks in the catering kitchen gaining valuable kitchen skills and will receive their food



handler's permit upon completion. Lastly, during Stage 3, students will merge their experience from classroom instruction and kitchen training to begin the biggest step, the job search.

Public Policy Update and June 11 Candidate Forum

The Whole Person will host a Kansas City At-Large and In-District Reception and Candidates Forum on Tuesday, June 11th at 6:00 pm (3710 Main Street). Come out and mingle with Mayoral Candidate, Jolie Justus and ask pertinent questions to those running for City Council.

Missouri's 100th General Assembly adjourned on May 17th. Accomplishments for this session include extension of the Non-Medicaid Eligible (NME) Program until 2025 (pending funding), increased funding for more IL Waivers and establishment of a statewide hearing aid distribution program.

The Kansas State legislature failed to pass Medicaid expansion.

TWP Announces Community Housing Partnership

TWP has exciting news regarding housing! Our largest project currently in progress is the Habitat for Humanity Community Partnership. This opportunity gives consumers an unparalleled chance at purchasing their own accessible home – for less than what they may pay for rent.

Families are selected into the program based on three criteria:

- 1. A demonstrated need for housing
- 2. A demonstrated ability to pay back a zero percent interest mortgage
- A willingness to partner with TWP and Habitat for Humanity to complete 350 sweat equity hours for their home
